Our Lent services involved a different liturgy this year, which used torn fabric, sweet wrappers, dolls furniture, a globe and a packet of seeds amongst other things to encourage us think about the journey that Christ was undertaking. We have had a very full schedule of services – some familiar and some new It's always good to see things through a different lens.

Following on from the decision to form a catering/hospitality team we have had some volunteers and we are grateful to Sarah Foster who has offered to co-ordinate this important aspect of our church life. If you think this is something that you might be called to help with please have a word with Sarah or one of the stewards.

It's become obvious that a lot of our services are getting busier. Whilst we thank God for this, it sometimes causes logistical problems. This has led to a revised Health and Safety audit of our communion services and the outcome is that when we are having one of these acts of worship the front row of chairs will be taken out of use to make it safe for us all to move around. The stewards will put 'reserved' notices on the chairs.

We will also be reviewing the place for the children during family service to ensure safety for all of our church family, young and not so young!

Seven Trent Water Update

Over the last few months members of the Property Committee have been in consultation with STW regarding the works and how it will affect church use. We have endeavoured to ensure that we are affected as little as possible and that we are being treated fairly and consulted in all matters.

Obviously we will be affected by the one-way system that will be in operation during June, but we will be more directly affected from Monday 03rd June to Friday 07th June this year. During these five days they will be installing the pipe across the bottom of our driveway, and therefore there will be no vehicular access to church. We will be okay to use the driveway for worship on Sunday 02nd June and it is anticipated, but not 100% guaranteed that we will be okay to use the driveway again on Sunday 09th June, and hopefully for coffee morning on Saturday 08th June. STW will keep us informed of progress during the week and notify us if they don't anticipate the work to be finished as planned, and if this is the case we will try to spread the word as far we can using social media and email.

Groups can continue to use the building during the week, but must understand there is no vehicular access for any vehicle including blue badge holders, and anyone wishing to attend will have to walk to their meeting. We would recommend that you consider suspending your meeting during this period, or arrange to meet elsewhere for this week. We can confirm that we will be compensated for any loss of outside rental the church suffers during this time.

We are also negotiating with STW to allow the residents of Spring Terrace to park on our front grassed area whilst work takes place along their road. This is anticipated to be from the end of June for a two or three weeks. Again we are being compensated for this, but as there will be a formal licence in place (to legally protect everybody and meet Methodist Charity Law) we will not be permitted to use the grass during this time. Signage will be in place for this time.

All of the above dates are anticipated to be correct after meeting STW and their contractor Avove on the 18th March, but may be subject to change, although we believe this is unlikely. Again, if there are any changes we will provide further information as soon as possible

Please ensure that no-one else contacts STW or their contractor, Avove, on behalf of Nuthall Methodist Church, as this may lead to confusion and undo the good relationships we have developed

We hope this is all self-explanatory, but should you require clarification then please don't hesitate to speak to David Blount.

I have a couple of volunteers who have very kindly agreed to help assist with this session when they are available. If you'd like to be involved, and spread the load, on an ad hoc basis, please let me know. It would allow parents and carers the space to leave their children for the hour if needed.



ECO-CHURCH NEWS

Thank you to those who joined us for our litter pick in March. A small group of us gathered around 10 bags of litter from Common Lane, New Farm Lane, Low Wood Road and along the multi-user path all the way from Low Wood Road to Newdigate Street. This was a good addition to the litter picking done by our regular groups around the area, and we were seen (and thanked) by several people who could easily see this was activity led by our church thanks to our Hi-vis vests. Thanks to the Communications team for publicising and celebrating this on our social media channels. We will aim to do further litter-picking events in the future but a reminder that this equipment is available for all church groups to use, just follow the risk assessment provided and please return equipment after use.



Now that it properly feels like spring, people's thoughts often turn to cleaning, and indeed we have our own church internal cleaning morning on April 13th. We thought this was a good opportunity to remind everyone that we try to use environmentally-friendly cleaning and

household products at church and you might want to think about at home too.

- 1. Reduce the products we use as every different bottle is more resources can the same products be used for more than one type of cleaning? Are there some we don't need at all?
- 2. Packaging can we reduce plastic? (e.g. buying toilet roll wrapped in paper, using cloths and sponges made from biodegradable alternatives), can we use products packaged in recycled plastic? Can we reduce the number of plastic bottles we buy? (e.g. we refill the bottles of hand soap, washing up liquid and toilet cleaner used at church)
- 3. Products how sustainable are the actual products we use? Choosing more environmentally friendly brands means they are less damaging to the waterways and wildlife.
