FROM THE MINISTER'S STUDY

Dear siblings in Christ,

Embracing the Mystery of the Trinity

As we journey together in faith, we often encounter profound mysteries that deepen our understanding of God's love and presence in our lives. One such mystery is the Holy Trinity—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This central tenet of our faith invites us into a relationship with God that is rich, complex, and deeply personal. We marked Trinity Sunday on May 26th, but I invite you to consider it beyond worship ...

The Trinity can be challenging to grasp, yet it is fundamental to our Christian belief. It reveals to us that God is one in essence but three in person. This concept is not about mathematics but about relationship and identity. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are distinct, yet they are one, coexisting in perfect unity and harmony. You may have heard preachers try and use visual illustrations to help grasp the concept of the trinity. The egg (shell, white, yolk) or water (ice, water, steam) or even an apple (skin, flesh, core) are all examples of this. They can be helpful ways in, but perhaps left there we can be in danger of possessing a faith which has not had the opportunity to mature. Let's consider the Trinity a little further ...

God the Father: The Creator and Sustainer In the Trinity, God the Parent* (often referred to as Father) is the source of all creation. He is the loving and sovereign Creator who spoke the universe into existence. Her parental love is evident throughout the Scriptures, where we see their desire for a relationship with His creation. As our parent, He sustains us, providing for our needs and guiding us with Her wisdom and grace.

* I purposely use different pronouns to refer to God the Creator as I seek to grapple with the nature of God as beyond our understanding, but a parent, nonetheless.

God the Son: The Redeemer and Friend God the Son, Jesus Christ, embodies the Father's love through His incarnation, life, death, and resurrection. Jesus is our Redeemer, the one who bridges the gap between humanity and God. He walked among us, experienced our struggles, and offered Himself as the ultimate sacrifice for our sins. Through Jesus, we are reconciled to the Father, and we are called His friends and co-heirs with

Christ. His life is a model of perfect love and obedience, inspiring us to live out our faith with compassion and humility.

God the Holy Spirit: The Comforter and Guide The Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity, is God's presence within us. In Hebrew, God's Spirit is used with the feminine word 'ruach', and I always refer to the Spirit in this way. She is the Comforter, who brings peace and assurance in times of trouble. The Holy Spirit empowers and equips us to live as faithful disciples of Christ, guiding us into all truth and reminding us of Jesus' teachings. Through the Spirit, we experience God's love and grace in a tangible way, and we are transformed into the likeness of Christ.

Living in the Light of the Trinity Understanding the Trinity enriches our worship and deepens our spiritual life. It reminds us that our relationship with God is dynamic and multifaceted. As we worship the Creator, follow the Son, and listen to the Spirit, we participate in the divine dance of the Trinity, experiencing God's love in its fullness.

In our church community, let us embrace the mystery of the Trinity with awe and gratitude. Let it inspire our worship, our fellowship, and our mission. As we gather for worship, may we feel the Parent's love, the Son's grace, and the Spirit's presence. In our daily lives, let us reflect the unity and love of the Trinity in our interactions with one another.

Closing Thoughts As we reflect on the Trinity, let us remember that it is not merely a doctrine to be understood but a reality to be lived. The Trinity calls us into a deeper relationship with God and with each other. It challenges us to love more fully, serve more faithfully, and live more authentically.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Would you like to be a member of Nuthall Methodist Church?

Wednesdays in July: 3rd, 10th, 17th, 24th at 10:30-11:30am in church.

There are many ways of belonging to the church including by attending worship and other activities in the building. Wonderfully, the Methodist Church also offers you the chance to show another step of commitment by being 'confirmed' and 'received into membership'. This means that there is a service in which you make promises - these are the same promises that are made when someone is baptised. If you have already been confirmed in another denomination, you can be received as a Methodist member by a simple act of welcome.

Becoming a 'member' is a way of saying that you belong to and support Nuthall Methodist Church and that you want to do this. Being a member of the Methodist Church means that you can hold certain responsibilities within the life of the church (e.g., steward, pastoral visitor, local preacher, member of the church council). If you are interested in exploring a little more of what membership means, then you are invited to a series of 4 sessions that Rev Jason will be leading during the regular Tea, Toast and Talk slot on a Wednesday morning. These sessions will be informal and will be held in the church. These sessions will be informal and will be held in the church. There is no obligation to become a member if you attend these sessions, but you are welcome to come and explore membership in the Methodist Church. The four sessions are as follows:

Seven Trent Water Update

STW have this week confirmed that there are no changes to the plan previously published and below:

Obviously we will be affected by the one-way system that will be in operation during June, but we will be more directly affected from Monday 03rd June to Friday 07th June. During these five days they will be installing the pipe across the bottom of our driveway, and therefore there will be no vehicular access to church. We will be okay to use the driveway for worship on Sunday 02nd June and it is anticipated, but not 100% guaranteed that we will be okay to use the driveway again on Sunday 09th June, and hopefully for coffee morning on Saturday 08th June. STW will keep us informed of progress during the week and notify us if they don't anticipate the work to be finished as planned, and if this is the case we will try to spread the word as far we can using social media and email.

Groups can continue to use the building during the week, but must understand there is no vehicular access for any vehicle including blue badge holders, and anyone wishing to attend will have to walk to their meeting. We would recommend that you consider suspending your meeting during this period, or arrange to meet elsewhere for this week. We can confirm that we will be compensated for any loss of outside rental the church suffers during this time.

We have also negotiated with STW to allow the residents of Spring Terrace to park on our front grassed area whilst work takes place along their road. This is anticipated at the beginning of June for two or three weeks. Again we are being compensated for this, but as there will be a formal licence in place (to legally protect everybody and meet Methodist Charity Law) we will not be permitted to use the grass during this time. Signage will be in place for this time.

Again, if there are any changes we will provide further information as soon as possible.

Please ensure that no-one else contacts STW or their contractor, Above, on behalf of Nuthall Methodist Church, as this may lead to confusion and undo the good relationships we have developed.

We hope this is all self-explanatory, but should you require clarification then please don't hesitate to speak to David Blount.

ECO-CHURCH NEWS

On **Saturday June 15th 10am-12noon** the EcoChurch group will be carrying out our annual walk around the grounds to look what we can see and note how this fits in with our Land Management Plan and what work is required moving forward. This also links in with the national “Churches Count on Nature” week which is from 8th to 16th June run by the organisations Caring for God’s Acre and A Rocha, so we plan to also try to log the plants and other wildlife we can find on our land on this date. Everyone is welcome of all ages if you would like to join in with us.

With (hopefully) some pleasant summer weather at the moment, it is a good time of year to think if you are able to walk or cycle to church instead of driving. It also seems timely when the nearby roadworks might mean it is quicker to travel to church activities a different way than by car! If you are cycling we have the cycle racks at the back of church so you can park up safely. Walking to church can be sociable, can improve your physical and mental health and help you take time to notice the beautiful world around us. We know it is not possible for everyone to avoid driving, but each car journey we avoid can help reduce air pollution and the emissions which contribute to climate change. If you need to use your car, is it possible to share lifts with a friend? Or you could think about how you drive: avoiding using the air conditioning and avoiding having the engine idling when stopped also helps to reduce fuel consumption. If you have an electric car, remember you can also charge this at church when you will be using the energy from the solar panels on our roof!
