FROM THE MINISTER'S STUDY

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Our Journey Together: Inclusive Church

Happy new Connexional year!

Here we are at the beginning of September (already!) The Methodist Church year runs from September – August and so it seems appropriate to begin with wishing you a happy new Connexional year!

You may well be aware that at our June General Church Meeting and the Church Council which followed it, we voted overwhelmingly in favour that Nuthall Methodist Church should join the Inclusive Church Network. After that meeting I began the application process, and I am pleased to say that as of mid-August we are now a registered inclusive church. You can find out more, and see our listing on the Inclusive Church website here: www.inclusive-church.org

As a result of this major step forward in our commitment to inclusivity, our church will be working hard (particularly in this first year) to review what we do and how we can become more inclusive for all people – in our life, worship, and witness together. I hope to set up an inclusive church monitoring group which will focus on this aspect of our church life and make suggestions for ways in which we can adapt what we do, where appropriate, to assist us in our commitment to become more inclusive. If you feel that this is something you would be interested in participating in, please do let me know.

In our joining of the network, we had to consider the 'Inclusive Church Statement' and agree that we felt Nuthall Methodist Church should adopt it as ours, too. As a church, we have agreed that:

"We believe in inclusive church – a church which celebrates and affirms every person and does not discriminate.

We will continue to challenge the church where it continues to discriminate against people on grounds of disability, economic power, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, learning disability, mental health, neurodiversity, or sexuality.

We believe in a Church which welcomes and serves all people in the name of Jesus Christ; which is scripturally faithful; which seeks to proclaim the Gospel

afresh for each generation; and which, in the power of the Holy Spirit, allows all people to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Jesus Christ.”

Nuthall Methodist Church already does a lot of what is mentioned above very well. However, we are always learning and as a church we have committed ourselves to continue reviewing what we do so that we can always celebrate and affirm every person, without discrimination. That is a challenge, and it is something which we need to participate in together – it requires us all to consider what we do and say.

We have registered our church so that it can be a visible sign that we are a safe place of worship for all people. Sadly, this is not the case in all churches, but I am pleased that NMC is a safe place. Now it can be known to those searching for a safe place before they even step in our building. As part of our commitment, we will celebrate Inclusive Church Sunday each year where the focus of our worship will be on inclusivity. In addition, there will be opportunities for further study in an inclusive church book club that I hope to coordinate shortly.

All in all, this journey has just begun, and together we will walk the path to full inclusion for all in the name of Christ, who calls us to love God and love our neighbours as ourselves. But we can have confidence that we journey ahead in the direction which our church vision calls us to be:

“A visible community presence, actively welcoming, loving and caring for all and God’s creation.”

My reflections in this newsletter for this Connexional year will focus on all aspects of our inclusion as a church. If you would like to discuss anything that has arisen for you out of reading this, please do get in touch. I would be very happy to talk with anyone who wants to know more or ask a question.

To finish – a prayer at the start of this new year:
Loving God,

As we mark the beginning of a new year in our Methodist tradition, we come before you with grateful hearts. We thank you for the blessings of the past year and for your steadfast presence in our lives. As we embark on this new journey, we seek your guidance and wisdom.

Help us to grow in faith and love, to serve our neighbours with compassion, and to share the light of Christ in every corner of our community. As we renew our commitments to you and to one another, inspire us to be inclusive in our outreach, bold in our witness, and faithful in our service. May the lessons learned from the past guide us as we strive to embody your love in all that we do.
