MINISTER'S MUSINGS

Dear siblings in Christ,

Celebrating Pride: A Reflection on Inclusion and Sexuality

As you will be aware, each of my reflections in this newsletter for this Connexional year will focus on all aspects of our inclusion as a church. This month we consider the ninth, and final, aspect of the Inclusive Church statement – sexuality.

June is internationally recognised as Pride Month—a time to celebrate the lives, identities, and contributions of LGBTQ+ people. Here in Nottingham, our city celebrates Pride on July 26th, and as a Methodist community committed to justice and inclusion, we are invited to stand alongside our LGBTQ+ siblings in faith, love, and solidarity in our Pride Praise service on July 27th at 6pm. The Inclusive Church Statement declares: "We believe in inclusive church – a church which celebrates and affirms every person and does not discriminate." This vision aligns deeply with our Methodist calling to be a Church of open hearts, open minds, and open doors. As followers of Christ, we are reminded again and again that God's love knows no bounds. It embraces each of us—regardless of sexuality, gender identity, or relationship status.

Pride offers us a moment to reflect on how well we are embodying that love. It invites us to ask: is our church truly a safe space for LGBTQ+people? Are our welcome signs matched by the warmth of our relationships, our language, and our theology?

As part of the Methodist Church in Britain, which in 2021 made historic decisions to allow same-sex marriages and affirm diverse understandings of relationships, we give thanks for progress—but we also acknowledge there is more to do. Inclusion is not a box we tick but a posture we adopt: of listening, learning, repenting, and growing.

So, whether you're intending on joining me and marching in the parade, praying in solidarity, or quietly offering welcome to others, know that your witness matters. Love is holy. Diversity is a gift. And in Christ, we are one body—beautifully diverse, wonderfully made.

This Pride season, may we be a Church where every person is truly known, celebrated, and affirmed as a beloved child of God.

God of love, thank you for the beautiful diversity of your people. We give thanks for LGBTQ+ lives and the gifts they bring to your Church.

Forgive us when we have excluded others, and help us to be a truly welcoming and inclusive community. As we mark Pride, may we stand for justice, celebrate love, and reflect your grace in all we do. In Jesus' name,


Can we count on you?

June 7th – 15th are the dates for two important national campaigns. "The Great Big Green Week" and "Churches Count on Nature". As part of both of these the EcoChurch team are holding our annual **Church Grounds Survey on Saturday 14th June, 9-11am.** All are welcome – come along and what plants and other wildlife are living on our land, how our grounds management plan is supporting this and whether there is anything we need to change. As this runs alongside coffee morning refreshments will be available.

The **Great Big Green Week** is organised by a group of organisations caring for the earth who have formed The Climate Coalition and is the UK's biggest celebration of community action to tackle climate change and protect nature. This week will see 1 million people from communities across the country swapping together for good to protect and restore nature, lessen the impact of climate change, strengthen our communities and demonstrate to politicians that they need to step up and play their part. What swaps could you make in your life to support this campaign?

Churches Count on Nature is a joint initiative run by the charities Caring for God's Acre and A Rocha UK (who run the EcoChurch scheme) together with the Church of England and the Church in Wales. This focuses on the wildlife living on church land and encourages us to record this.

June is a busy month because it also includes **World Bike Day on June 3**rd and in the **UK Bike Week is 9**th-15th. Cycling is good for your health and our planet, being a sustainable way of travel without causing any carbon emissions. If possible, can you replace any car journeys with a bike ride? Remember we have our cycle racks at church if you are able to cycle to any services or events here!
